The Stanford Achievement Test scores for the recent end of year testing will be

available to you in the near future. As these results can be puzzling, I have

invited two of our veteran homeschool mothers, Lisa Liffbrig and Carol Chambers, to help "demystify" the test reports.

Lisa is completing her homeschooling career within her family this year, as the Liffbrigs' younger
